

Stamford Christmas Festival 2018

Sunday 25 November from 10am to 5pm

The popular traditional Stamford Christmas Festival will be returning to Stamford. The event will be centered around High St, Ironmonger St, Broad Street, Red Lion Square, and Sheep Market.

Stamford is well known for its exclusive and independent traders so do come along and see what unusual gifts you may find for those very special to you! There will be traditional craft stalls offering a wide range of popular and stylish gifts with treats and delights to excite and tantalize. So come along, join in the fun and be part of this ever-popular annual, community event which attracts many thousands of visitors from far and near. The town has good **FREE** car parking facilities on Sundays with the town centre easily accessible. Parking is free in car parks on this day, but please be aware that on street parking restrictions are still enforced.

To add to the festive spirit there will be entertainment throughout the day including festive Punch and Judy shows, entertainment stage in the square, Friends of Stamford and Rutland THEATRE carol singing, Santa's Grotto, real reindeer, a children's Fun Fair and, of course, culminating with the Christmas lights switch-on!

This year the opportunity to turn on the Town's Christmas lights was the winner of the Town Council Spooktacular Halloween Pumpkin Competition. Amaris Whitefield (*Stamford*) was the lucky winner. She will meet the deputy Mayor Councillor Breda-Rae Griffin and together they will ride in Santa's Sleigh, with Santa through the town led by members of Stamford Pantomime Players "Sleeping Beauty" singing Christmas songs and carols. They will arrive at Red Lion Square at approximately 4.30pm where in front of the waiting crowd Amaris will turn on the Christmas lights for 2018.

RAF Wittering and Stamford Commemorate Battle of Britain

THE FEW were remembered on Sunday 16th September 2018 as RAF WITTERING personnel and the people of historic Stamford commemorated the Battle of Britain.

Trinity Methodist Church in Stamford was the venue for the special service, followed by a wreath laying ceremony at the town's war memorial on Broad Street. Held in the Royal Air Force's hundredth year, the event held a special significance for military personnel and townsfolk alike.

Over thirty Royal Air Force personnel paraded in full dress uniform, and marched from the church to the War Memorial outside the celebrated Browne's Hospital with musical support from Yarwell and Nassington Band.

The world's first independent Air Force was born in the heart of battle during WWI, and created for a single purpose – to defend Britain's skies. This role continues to inspire people from almost every background to join the Royal Air Force.

The Battle of Britain was fought in the skies over Britain during the summer and autumn of 1940 and, over seventy years later it remains the defining engagement in the Royal Air Force's hundred-year history.

2018 is a very important year in regard to anniversaries. The Royal Air Force, and RAF Wittering both celebrate their 100th year of existence along with 100 years since the end of the first world war in 1918.


It was thought Stamford should have a permanent record of this year and discussions over the last few months resulted in a positive suggestion from Mr. Don Lambert who is a member of the Stamford Urban Group, who had seen some exterior bench seats when visiting St Davids in Wales. After discussion with Councillor Tony Story, the Town Council and the local branch of the Royal British Legion, Don began to visit various businesses in Stamford to see if he could raise the necessary funding, which for two seats cost, including delivery, taxes, fitting and site tidying up, is a total of £2,523. It may be possible to add a third seat depending on the level of donations.

He has been very successful and some of our local County and District Councillors have now also provided donations from the grants they are allotted each year from SKDC.

Plans are now moving forward with an order expected to be made to the manufacturers on Thursday 22nd November.

Delivery and fitting should take place in January 2019. Both seats will be fitted complete with donor plaques in Castle Dyke (Bath Row) and a further press release and photograph will then be issued listing all our very generous donor's details.

Don Lambert and Cllr. Tony Story would like to thank all involved for their generosity and support in creating this permanent memory in Stamford of the fallen in both World Wars."



REMEMBRANCE DAY SERVICE AND PARADE



On the occasion of the Centenary of the Armistice and the end of hostilities in WW1

The Annual Service of Remembrance and Laying of Wreaths took place at the War Memorial, Broad Street, Stamford, on Sunday, 11 November 2018.

The Service began with a prayer by the The Rev. Canon Stephen Simcox, Hon. Chaplain of the Stamford Branch RBL, followed by the Exhortation, Last Post at 11.00am, the Two Minute Silence, Reveille, and Kohima. The Stamford Brass Band accompanied the service during the wreath laying, with poppies being dropped by cadets during the 2 minute silence. A very moving poem was recited from Browne's balcony by Chris Martin, Stamford's poet laureate entitled "We're not gone while we are remembered"



The officer in charge of the Royal Air Force Detachment assumed overall command of the parade at the War Memorial and marching units including RAF Wittering, The Royal British Legion, Stamford School Combined Cadet Force, 2071 (Stamford) Sqn ATC. Stamford Army Cadet Force, St John Ambulance, Welland Girlguiding.

The Deputy Mayor of Stamford, Councillor Miss Breda-Rae Griffin presided and her guests included dignitaries, military personnel, representatives from schools, colleges and hospitals and various organisations within the town.

The beacon was lit at The Recreation Ground at 7pm joined by All Saints' Church ringing their bells. The event was well attended and thanks go to Hinch Plant Hire for sponsoring this nationwide event.



Stamford Dog Show breaks all records

The thirteenth annual Stamford Dog Show and Family Fun Day took place in September and was attended by a record breaking crowd.

There were 325 entries for the judging of both pedigree and novelty classes. 182 dogs were entered by their owners. Also at the show were a display of reptiles from the Amphibian Reptile & Insect Association in Northampton and alpacas from Ridgeview Farm in Belmesthorpe. The show was supported by many different stall holders, dog agility displays and funfair rides for the children.

This popular show is organised by Stamford Methodist Church with huge support from Stamford Veterinary Centre and Pets Korner. Each year every penny from the show goes towards the charities being supported by the church. This year they are the Nixon Memorial Hospital in a remote part of Sierra Leone, the Mutts Nutts Rescue and the Youth Outreach Programme which runs the Shack in the Recreation Ground. A record £2,750 was raised for these charities.

The Mutts Nutts Rescue were awarded 20% of the takings from the show at a presentation of a cheque for £550 by the Deputy Mayor of Stamford Councillor Miss Breda-Rae Griffin.

Proud parents, bystanders and streams of well-wishers admired the procession as excited graduates paraded through the town centre after successfully graduating from their degree level courses at Higher Education Centre Stamford.




