STAMFORD CEMETERY

INFORMATION FOR EXCLUSIVE RIGHT OF BURIAL HOLDERS

(Please read this document and keep it together with your Deed)

Stamford Town Council own the land detailed above and will give a Grant of Right of Burial for 50 years to the person named as purchaser. As the Council owns the land there are regulations which must be adhered to.

- Edging, kerbstones or permanently secured borders should not be placed anywhere on the grave space
- Chippings should not be placed anywhere on the grave space
- **Glass** containers, vases or ornaments should not be placed anywhere on the grave space
Ornaments or solar lights should only be placed in the head row although the Authority will not accept any liability for their loss or damage
- **No conifers, trees or large shrubs to be planted in any area of the grave space**
- Plastic “in memory” vases may be placed in the head row but are limited to two per grave
- **The grassed area in front of the head row must be clear of items at all times**

Deeds for new graves will be produced and sent to you in the post and must be kept safe and produced for further interments.

We may need to contact you to inform you that soil boards will be placed on your grave space when burials take place in adjacent graves. It is important to keep us informed of current contact details.

Memorial stones of any type must be supplied and fixed through an approved memorial mason or funeral director. The earliest date for placing a memorial between 12” and 3 feet high after a full burial should be at least five to six months, unless on pre-installed landings. Memorial masons should advise you of this.

Surveys of memorial stones will be undertaken in the Stamford Cemetery at least once every two years.
