# Town Hall renovations nearing completion


The first phase of the Town Hall renovation programme is nearing completion.

The strengthening and relaying of the entrance hall floor, significant improvements to the disabled access facilities, including the installation of a lift to all floors, are some of the major works which have been undertaken.

This first phase encompasses a number of essential maintenance works to improve and enhance the safety of the building for both the public and staff. This vital work has been enabled through prudent fiscal management by the Town Council.

There are three future phases scheduled which the Town Council hopes to resource with assistance from Heritage Lottery funding. This carefully scheduled programme will restore this historic building to its original beauty, with new displays exhibiting many interesting historical artefacts from Stamford's colourful past.





## Treasure in Stamford Town Hall Attic

Recent contact from the makers of a new BBC2 programme, Antiques Roadshow Restoration, provided Stamford Town Council with an ideal opportunity to discover more about an oil painting of King Charles II found stacked with other pictures against a wall in a Town Hall attic.

Having been sent the requested photograph of the painting, the programme makers visited the Town Hall and were very excited at the 'find', as well as a terracotta bust of a Dutch woman also stored in the attic.

Art expert Eric Knowles confirmed the painting was indeed that of King Charles II, and that it was possibly painted in the 1690s by an as yet unidentified artist. As part of the new TV programme the damage has been stabilised and some exploratory cleaning undertaken by restoration expert Lucia Scalisi, ready for future cleaning and full restoration. The carved wooden frame also requires repairs and regilding. The value of the painting, estimated in the thousands of pounds, has yet to be fully assessed.

Cllr. John Dawson and the Town Clerk Patricia Stuart-Mogg will be seen discussing the painting and bust with Eric Knowles and Lucia Scalisi when the programme is screened in March next year. The Antiques Roadshow production team has requested a future visit to the Town Hall to discuss filming a further programme.

# Sir Malcolm Sargent Collection

Stamford Town Council is delighted to announce that it has been granted custodianship of a significant collection of memorabilia belonging to the late Sir Malcolm Sargent, one of England's most renowned musical conductors, an expupil of Stamford School and former Stamford resident. The items were placed with the Town Council by Miss Sylvia Darley, who was secretary and assistant to Sir Malcolm for more than 20 years. The collection, which includes Sir Malcolm's musical scores, batons and many other notable exhibits, will be on public display in a newly-dedicated room when the renovation of the Town Hall is complete.

### Youth Council

Stamford Town Council is currently working through the Cluster Project to introduce a Youth Council for Stamford. The aim is to have council meetings composed of secondary school pupils and, taking place at Stamford Town Hall, will discuss local and national issues and put forward their views to the Town Council. We believe that this will be an important contribution to local democracy and give local youth an opportunity to express their concerns and opinions.

#### Education

Stamford Town Council views with grave concern, the proposal by Casterton College to establish an 11-18 college and has made strong representations to Lincolnshire Council. Such a move, on the borders of Stamford, will jeopardise the futures of both the Queen Eleanor Technology College, and impact learners' choice of options at New College. Both of these institutions, which are major employers in Stamford, have worked in recent years in close collaboration with Stamford Endowed Schools to ensure high quality education and vocational training for the children of Stamford. Any threat to the viability of Queen Eleanor Technology College will have serious consequences for Stamford and the local economy.

## Free Charitable use of Town Hall

During the course of the year the Town Hall is made available, free of charge, for six charitable events or worthy causes. Selection is entirely at the Mayor's personal discretion and is strictly subject to availability. Applications giving fullest details of the charity or cause supported and the event proposed should be submitted, in writing, to the Town Clerk, Town Hall, St. Mary's Hill, Stamford PE9 2DR.

## Planning Applications

Stamford Town Council considers all planning applications submitted to South Kesteven District Council (SKDC) and offers its own recommendations, which are not binding. If you wish to submit any comments to support or object to any planning application, this should be done via SKDC's Development Control Department with a copy to the Town Council Planning Committee Chairman.
