
# Stamford TOWN COUNCIL NEWS

# STADFAS Open Morning

On Tuesday 21st April an Open Morning was held at Stamford Town Hall by the Heritage Volunteers of the Stamford branch of the National Association of Decorative and Fine Art Societies (STADFAS). The Heritage Volunteers explained and displayed the conservation work they have been doing with books and maps at the Town Hall. There were examples of books both legal and from the Phillips Collection, which contains information and articles on Stamford , dating back to the eighteenth century as well as maps ranging from proposed bypass routes to old railway maps which have been cleaned and repaired.

The Town Hall also showed some of the treasures awaiting repair - nineteenth century posters, parchment land ownership documents and two precious Hall Books dating from the fifteenth century.

# Gurkhas - Watch Handover

On a bright sunny morning in March Stamford watchmakers and manufacturers, Loomes & Co, hosted a prestigious event at the Town Hall.

It was the beginning of an extraordinary journey for a number of entirely British-made mechanical watches. The Mayor of Stamford welcomed the Lord Lieutenant of Lincolnshire, representatives from the Nepali Embassy, the British Horological Institute and the Royal Gurkha Regiment climbing team.



The team, led by Captain Dick Gale, flew out to Nepal and spent six weeks trekking and climbing at high altitude. On the 25th April a huge earthquake struck. The team were climbing on Everest on that very day. They immediately switched from climbing to disaster relief work in Nepal.

The Gurkhas returned to Britain at the end of May after seventy days. According to Captain Gale, the Stamford made watches "worked perfectly".

It is expected that one expedition wristwatch will be on display in Stamford Town Hall shortly and one is at the British Horological Institute near Newark. Both watches will be sold later this year, with proceeds going to support the Mountain Trust and the Gurkha Welfare Trust.

# **Skells Trust Charity**

The Skells Trust is a charity established with a bequest from Mr Harry Skells which offers grants for works within the Town meeting its clearly specified criteria. Applications are welcome for grants and are considered several times a year.
