Mayors Blindfold Walk

Stamford's Mayor, Cllr John Dawson and Stamford & District Lions Club President Gill Clarke took a walk along the High Street on Wednesday to promote Sight Awareness Day on Friday 21st October in the Arts Centre from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

A blindfolded Cllr Dawson felt a little frightened at not being able to see where he was walking and said that it gave him a good indication of what it was like for people with sight problems. Lion President Gill guided him through the High Street pointing out any problems along the way and explaining exactly where they were so that the Mayor could visualise his surroundings.

Cllr. Dawson's blindfolded walk should be a reminder to everyone that regardless of age people need to take care of their eyes. Many sight problems develop slowly and are dismissed as part of the aging process, but sight problems have no age barrier and there is treatment available to prevent further sight loss.



The local Lions Club is holding the Sight Awareness event to give people the opportunity to get information about some of the many common causes of sight loss. The free event is open to everyone and to answer questions there will be representatives from the Royal National Institute for the Blind, Glaucoma International Association, Macular Association, Diabetes UK, Talking Newspaper and local Ophthalmologists and Opticians.

Every October Lions Clubs International celebrates the power and gift of Sight. Since 1925, when Helen Keller challenged them to be Knights of the Blind, Lions have supported those who are visually impaired and blind and are the world's leading non-governmental organisation fighting preventable blindness. There are 39 million blind people in the world so imagine visiting New York, London and then Tokyo and everyone you meet is blind. That is the extent of blindness and 80% is preventable.

As part of the fight against sight loss, Lions Clubs recycle unwanted spectacles for use in the developing world. There will be a collecting box at the event should you wish to donate your unwanted spectacles. Contact 07946 629098 or 08458 334327 for further details.

Town Hall Tours

The free guided tours of the Town Hall, conducted by our volunteer guides, continue to be popular. Over the last five months there have been 226 visitors on Fridays and 95 on pre-arranged tours on other days.

Visitors are shown round the Hall (including the old Borough weights and measures, information about Daniel Lambert and the Military Cabinet), the Mayor's Parlour (which contains the Civic Regalia), the Malcolm Sargent permanent exhibition, the Council Chamber and the Courtroom. By special request, the Dungeons can also be included.

Town Hall Hire

Battle of Britain Service & Parade 2016

The Annual Battle of Britain Service & Parade took place on Sunday 25th September 2016. The Mayor of Stamford, Councillor John Dawson met dignitaries, civic heads and military personnel at the Town Hall, along with serving councillors, past mayors, representatives from schools. colleges, hospitals organisations. A procession through the Town led by Stamford Brass arrived at All Saints' church for a service of Commemoration and Thanksgiving for victory in the Battle of Britain. During the service Sqn Leader Mark Hassal read the lesson and the chaplain from RAF Wittering Reverend Sqn Leader David C Haslam delivered the Sermon.

Following the service the Civic Party was joined by a detachment from RAF Wittering Stamford Army Cadets Force, Stamford School CCF and 2071 Sqn Air cadets. The procession made the short journey to the War Memorial in Broad Street, Stamford.

The crowd waited in anticipation of the scheduled fly-past of a solitary Spitfire. It arrived at 12.40pm and circled the War Memorial three times. Wreaths were laid by the Mayor and the Station Commander before the Mayor gave permission for all units to march off.

The event culminated with refreshments being served at Browne's hospital and the poet laureate Camilla McLean recited her specially written poem for the occasion 'Beyond the Few'.



Castle Dyke plan

STC will soon submit a planning application for the improvement of the small paved area (which the council owns) at the bottom of Castle Dyke.

The scheme involves the refurbishment and re-siting of the benches, installing the terracotta brick Royal Arms rescued from the Williamson Cliff site and installing two or three free-standing planters.

None of the proposed work will affect the archway of the old Leet Hall (a scheduled ancient monument), nor the listed North wall, the proposed items being positioned at least 1 metre away from each to permit access for maintenance and or repair.

A plan of the proposal will soon be on the STC website and comments/suggestions are invited.
